## Summary of Key Points Analysis of Exit Destinations by County, Program Type, and By Program

October 2017

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The HMIS admin team completed analysis of client exit destinations from HMIS program discharge records for the month of October 2017 (n = 1,149 total exits). The analysis presents findings by county, over program type, and by program.

The summary tables highlight the total exits by destination category, along with overall permanent housing exit rates. Analysis also includes the total number of exits with unknown exit destination type along with the corresponding exit rates.

Assessing the level of PH placements is an essential part of determining performance for the many projects that operate within the CoC. State and federal funding is becoming increasingly tied to performance in this key area. The analysis presented within this report aligns closely with Measure 7 of the HUD System Performance Measures: Successful Placement from Street Outreach and Successful Placement in or Retention of Permanent Housing. Most recently submitted performance data for metrics 7a1, 7b1, and 7b2 can serve as baselines for monthly comparative analysis. Key findings of the October 2017 reporting include:


- In aggregate, the PH exit rate for October was 37% with 430 of the 1,149 exits, up slightly from Sep 2017, which closed at 34%.
- Of the 430 PH exits, Emergency Shelters exited 122 clients to PH (28%), followed by Transitional Shelters with 113 exits (26%).
- It must be emphasized that Street Outreach and Emergency Shelter project types should not be evaluated solely on exits to PH. Often, placements into institutional settings, shelters, or residential projects are positive outcomes.
- October PH rates descending by county were Hawaii (61%), Oahu (36%), Maui (30%), Kauai (25%).
- Homeless Prevention projects had the highest PH exit rates due to the inherent nature of these programs, followed by Permanent Supportive Housing and Rapid-Re-housing.
- The number of clients with unknown exit data decreased from 461 to 356 clients in October, however, the missing exit data rate held steady at 31% due to the lower number of total discharges.
- Oahu and Maui had the most exits to unknown locations in October, with 37% (301) and 22% (40) of all
  discharges exiting to these destinations, respectively. Usually exits within these categories are from ES or
  Outreach projects, however, Maui also had a high rate within this category exiting from the TH project
  type. Oahu projects should also strive to decrease the total number of unknown discharges from PSH and
  TH project types, which represented 12% (37) of the unknown discharges during October.
- Oahu Homeless Outreach programs had the highest rate of missing exits in October (72%), which can
  generally be attributed to auto-exiting. This should continue to be monitored, especially with HPO
  contracts shifting towards a housing first approach and the negative impact missing exits have on the
  CoC's System Performance Measures.
