

## Summary of Key Points

### Analysis of Exit Destinations by County, Program Type, and Organization

For March 2019

The HMIS admin team completed analysis of client exit destinations from HMIS program discharge records for the month of March 2019 (n = 1,198). The analysis presents findings by county, over program type, and by org/program.

The summary tables show the total exits by destination category, along with permanent housing exit rates. Analysis also includes the total number of exits with unknown exit destination type along with the corresponding exit rates.

Key findings of the monthly reporting include:

- In aggregate, the PH exit rate for March was 43% with 514 of 1,198 exits leaving to PH destinations, a significant decrease compared to February 2019 (61%). One reason for this decreased rate may be due to a significant increase in clients with missing exit destination data reported during March (25%) compared to February (14%).
- Of the 514 PH exits, Homeless Prevention programs exited 158 clients to PH (31%), Rapid Re-Housing exited 143 clients to PH (28%), Emergency Shelter programs exited 107 clients to PH (21%), Transitional facilities exited 51 clients to PH (10%) and Outreach programs exited 34 clients to PH (7%).
- Street Outreach and Emergency Shelter project types should not be evaluated solely on exits to PH. Often, placements into institutional settings, transitional shelters, or residential projects are positive outcomes for these project types and the clients within.
- March PH rates descending by county were Kauai (76%), Hawaii (56%), Oahu (42%), and Maui (36%).
- Homeless Prevention and Rapid Re-Housing projects PH exit rates dropped in March. Respective rates in February were 92% and 90%, but decreased to 80% and 43% in March. Due to the inherent nature of these programs, one would expect that these rates be near 100%.
- The missing exit data rate increased by eleven percentage points in March 2019 to 25% (304 clients with unknown exit destinations). In March 2019, Oahu represented 84% (256) of the missing total.
- Oahu and Hawaii had the greatest proportion of exits to unknown locations in March, with 29% for Oahu (256 of 877 exits), and 19% for Maui (16 of 84 exits). ES and Outreach projects accounted for many of these exits, but Oahu Rapid Rehousing programs had 109 exits with missing exit destinations compared to one exit that lacked data in February.
- Oahu Street Outreach (45%) and Oahu Rapid Rehousing programs (38%) had the highest rates of missing exit data in March.

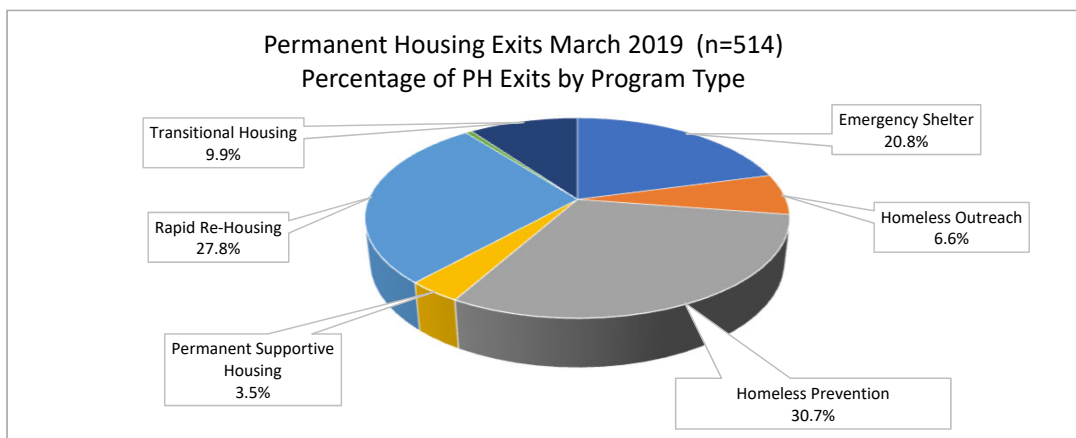
