Analysis of Exit Destinations by County, Program Type, and Organization

For June 2019

Ka Mana O Na Helu, HMIS Administration

The HMIS admin team completed analysis of client exit destinations from HMIS program discharge records for the month of June 2019 (n = 1,223). The analysis presents findings by county, over program type, and by org/program3

The summary tables show the total exits by destination category, along with permanent housing exit rates. Analysis also includes the total number of exits with unknown exit destination type along with the corresponding exit rates.

Key findings of the monthly reporting include:

- In aggregate, the PH exit rate for June was 61%, with 745 of 1,223 exits leaving to PH destinations, an increase compared to May 2019 (54%). June's PH exit rate is above the average for the last 12 months (54%).
- Of the 745 PH exits, Homeless prevention programs exited 336 clients to PH (45%), Rapid Re-Housing programs exited 194 clients to PH (26%), Emergency Shelter programs exited 97 clients to PH (13%), Transitional facilities exited 56 clients to PH (8%), and Outreach programs exited 37 clients to PH (5%).
- Street Outreach and Emergency Shelter project types should not be evaluated solely on exits to PH. Often, placements into institutional settings, transitional shelters, or residential projects are positive outcomes for these project types and the clients within.
- June PH rates descending by county were Hawaii (67%), Oahu (66%), Kauai (63%), and Maui (31%).
- Homeless Prevention and Rapid Re-Housing programs' PH exit rates were 97% and 93% respectively. Due to the inherent nature of these programs, one would expect that these rates be near 100%.
- The missing exit data rate for June was 11%, four percentage points lower than May.
- Maui and Oahu had the greatest proportion of exits to unknown locations in June (12%). ES and Outreach projects accounted for most of these exits. Hawaii and Kauai programs were not missing any exit destinations in client records; all exits destinations were recorded in HMIS.
- Oahu Street Outreach programs had the highest rate of missing exit data in June (40%), but this was an improvement compared to May's missing exit data rate (51%).

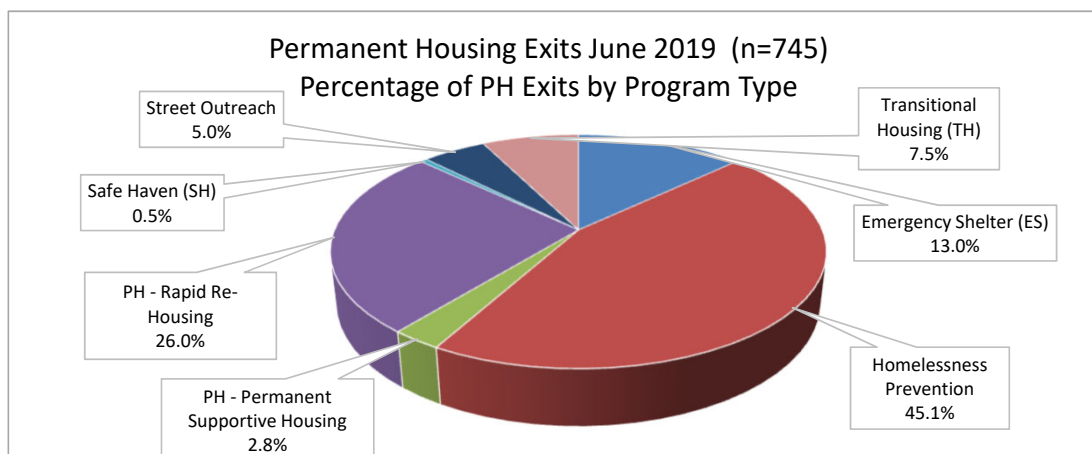
