## Summary of Key Points Analysis of Exit Destinations by County, Program Type, and Organization

For January 2018

The HMIS admin team completed analysis of client exit destinations from HMIS program discharge records for the month of January 2018 (n = 1,124). The analysis presents findings by county, over program type, and by org/program.

The summary tables show the total exits by destination category, along with permanent housing exit rates. Analysis also includes the total number of exits with unknown exit destination type along with the corresponding exit rates.

Key findings of the monthly reporting include:

- In aggregate, the PH exit rate for January was 41% with 466 of 1,124 exits leaving to PH destinations, down slightly from December (44%)
- Of the 466 PH exits, Emergency Shelter programs exited 179 clients to PH (38%), followed by Transitional Housing with 89 exits (19%).
- Street Outreach and Emergency Shelter project types should not be evaluated solely on exits to PH. Often, placements into institutional settings, transitional shelters, or residential projects are positive outcomes for these project types.
- January PH rates descending by county were Hawaii (50%), Maui (43%), Oahu (40%), and Kauai (20%).
- Homeless Prevention and Rapid Re-Housing projects had the highest PH exit rates (73% and 68% respectively) due to the inherent nature of these programs, however, one would expect that these rates be closer to 100%.
- The number of clients with unknown exit data continued to trend downward with 224 clients in January 2018. The missing exit data rate was the lowest yet at 20%, compared to 27% in December 2017.
- Oahu and Hawaii had the most exits to unknown locations in January, with 27% (175) and 13% (28) of all discharges exiting to these destinations, respectively. Usually ES or Outreach projects represent the vast majority of these exits.
- Oahu Homeless Outreach programs had the highest rate of missing exits in January (44%), which
  can generally be attributed to auto-exiting. This is a significant decrease compared to
  December's missing exit rate for Oahu's Homeless Outreach Programs (80%).


