

## Summary of Key Points

### Analysis of Exit Destinations by County, Program Type, and Organization

For May 2018

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The HMIS admin team completed analysis of client exit destinations from HMIS program discharge records for the month of May 2018 (n = 1,676). The analysis presents findings by county, over program type, and by org/program.

The summary tables show the total exits by destination category, along with permanent housing exit rates. Analysis also includes the total number of exits with unknown exit destination type along with the corresponding exit rates.

Key findings of the monthly reporting include:

- In aggregate, the PH exit rate for May was 58% with 978 of 1,676 exits leaving to PH destinations, continuing an increasing trend since July 2017 (33%).
- The number of exits in May were significantly higher than in April for the Homeless Prevention and Rapid Re-housing programs, which accounts for the jump in the permanent housing placement rate from 48% in April to 58% in May.
- Of the 978 PH exits, Homeless Prevention programs exited 454 clients to PH (46%) and Rapid Re-Housing programs exited 257 clients to PH (26%). Emergency Shelter programs exited 122 clients to PH (12%).
- Street Outreach and Emergency Shelter project types should not be evaluated solely on exits to PH. Often, placements into institutional settings, transitional shelters, or residential projects are positive outcomes for these project types. These are also presented in the tables.
- May PH rates descending by county were Hawaii (82%), Oahu (55%), Maui (44%), and Kauai (30%).
- Homeless Prevention and Rapid Re-Housing projects had the highest PH exit rates (95% and 85% respectively). Due to the inherent nature of these programs the expectation is that these PH exit rates be close to 100%.
- The missing exit data rate continued a downward trend and was 13% in May (218 clients with unknown exits). The missing exit data rate, first calculated in July 2017 was 34%.
- Oahu and Maui had the greatest proportion of exits to unknown locations in May, with 17% (179 exits) for Oahu and 14% (30 exits) for Maui. Usually ES or Outreach projects represent the vast majority of these exits.
- Maui Emergency Shelter (33%) and Oahu Homeless Outreach programs (47%) had the highest rates of missing data for exits in May.

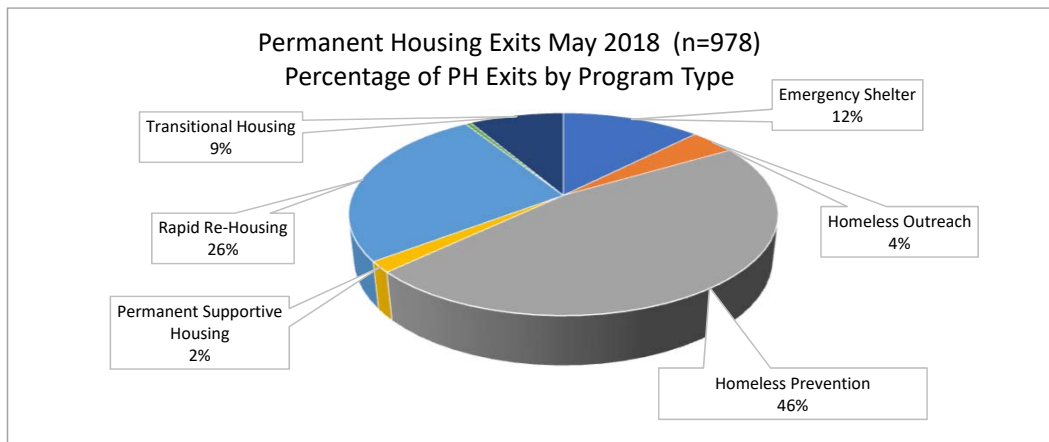
