

Summary of Key Points
Analysis of Exit Destinations by County, Program Type, and Organization

The HMIS admin team completed analysis of client exit destinations from HMIS program discharge records for the month of October 2018 (n = 1,297). The analysis presents findings by county, over program type, and by org/program.

The summary tables show the total exits by destination category, along with permanent housing exit rates. Analysis also includes the total number of exits with unknown exit destination type along with the corresponding exit rates.

Key findings of the monthly reporting include:

- In aggregate, the PH exit rate for October was 61% with 785 of 1,297 exits leaving to PH destinations, representing an increase compared to September (54%) and a continued improvement trend since October 2017 (33%).
- Of the 785 PH exits, Homeless Prevention programs exited 332 clients to PH (42%), Emergency Shelter programs exited 154 clients each to PH (20%), Transitional facilities exited 138 clients to PH (18%) and Rapid Re-Housing exited 123 clients to PH (16%).
- Street Outreach and Emergency Shelter project types should not be evaluated solely on exits to PH. Often, placements into institutional settings, transitional shelters, or residential projects are positive outcomes for these project types and the clients within.
- October PH rates descending by county were Hawaii (84%), Oahu (62%), Kauai (50%), and Maui (33%).
- Homeless Prevention and Rapid Re-Housing projects had the highest PH exit rates (94% and 81% respectively). Due to the inherent nature of these programs, however, one would expect that these rates be near 100%.
- The missing exit data rate decreased in October 2018 to 14% (183 clients with unknown exits), a slight improvement compared to September's 15% missing data rate. June 2018 had the lowest rate to date (12%). The missing exit rate first calculated in October 2017 was 34%. Oahu represented 89% (164) of the missing total.
- Oahu and Maui had the greatest proportion of exits to unknown locations in October, with 17% (164 of 946 exits) for Oahu, and 10% (15 of 153 exits) for Maui. ES and Outreach projects accounted for the vast majority of these exits.
- Oahu Street Outreach (64%) and Emergency Shelter (29%), and Maui Emergency Shelter (13%) had the highest rates of missing exit data in October.


