# Summary of Key Points Analysis of Exit Destinations by County, Program Type, and Organization Neighbor Islands – Bridging the Gap

For March 2020

### Ka Mana O Na Helu, HMIS Administration

The HMIS administrative team completed analysis of client exit destinations from HMIS Bridging the Gap program discharge records for the month of March 2020 (n = 314). The analysis presents findings by county, over program type, and by org/program.

The summary tables show the total exits by destination category, along with permanent housing (PH) exit rates. The analysis also includes the total number of exits with unknown exit destination type along with the corresponding exit rates.

Key findings of the monthly reporting include:

- In aggregate, the PH exit rate for March was 53%, with 166 of 314 exits leaving to PH destinations, a decrease compared to February 2020 (57%). BTG's PH exit rate averaged 56% over the last 7 months. This is the period that BTG data tracking has been separated from PIC programs; the combined statewide average PH exit rate was 54% from March through August 2019.
- Of the 166 exits to PH, rapid re-housing programs exited 47 clients to PH (28%), homeless prevention programs exited 34 clients to PH (20%), emergency shelter exited 32 clients to PH (19%), street outreach exited 28 clients to PH (17%), and transitional facilities exited 23 clients to PH (14%).
- March PH rates descending by county were Hawaii (65%), Maui (47%), and Kauai (38%).
- Homeless prevention and rapid re-housing programs' PH exit rates rebounded this month to 97% and 92% respectively, compared to February rates: 68% and 82% respectively. The average rates for 2019 were 92% for homeless prevention and 84% for rapid re-housing programs. Due to the inherent nature of these programs, one would expect that these PH exit rates be near 100%.
- The missing exit data rate for March was 7%, a decrease compared to February (17%), below the average for the past 7 months (14%).
- Maui had the greatest number of exits to unknown locations in March (14 exits) with emergency shelter and transitional housing accounting for most of these exits. Hawaii had 6 exits to unknown locations and Kauai had 3 exits to unknown locations.


